At our most recent meeting, current net loss for this fiscal year was reported at \$55,218. Though sobering, this was not entirely unanticipated since we have been operating on a deficit budget. The shortfall has been supported by withdrawals from the endowment. Much is due to this past year's challenges during the pandemic. Resuming church services should help our revenue as we slowly resume more of our normal activities.

The report from the Investment Advisory Team was overall positive, with value holding steady, though some of the returns for the first quarter were not optimal.

Stewardship will be promoted this year with a series of "Stewardship Moments" presented each Sunday until June 20th. Pledge cards have been mailed to all of you and we hope to receive them back soon.

In closing, a shout-out to all people who helped put on the Rummage/Yard Sale. It was truly inspirational to see all the effort put into that successful event. Congratulations to all!

The Finance Committee has been putting in some extra meeting time trying to work out next year's budget. A final draft has not yet been completed. It will be ready to be presented for the approval of the congregation at the annual meeting.

At our most recent meeting, current net loss for this fiscal year was reported at \$55,218. Though sobering, this was not entirely unanticipated since we have been operating on a deficit budget. The shortfall has been supported by withdrawals from the endowment. Much is due to this past year's challenges during the pandemic. Resuming church services should help our revenue as we slowly resume more of our normal activities.

The report from the Investment Advisory Team was overall positive, with value holding steady, though some of the returns for the first quarter were not optimal.

Stewardship will be promoted this year with a series of "Stewardship Moments" presented each Sunday until June 20th. Pledge cards have been mailed to all of you and we hope to receive them back soon.

In closing, a shout-out to all people who helped put on the Rummage/Yard Sale. It was truly inspirational to see all the effort put into that successful event. Congratulations to all!

We met with and contracted Bill Farrell of William Farrell Video Productions to film by aerial drone the steeple and the roof of the Church. Bill got some very good photos of the damage to the steeple and roof that we will present at the annual meeting.

We have scheduled Expert Pest Services to spray around the Parsonage and Church for black ants, which have now become active.

It is with eager anticipation that we await the beginning of repair work on the steeple. We expect work to begin in early July. Be warned the front area of the Church will be taped off as a work zone for safety.

That's our list, so let's get going. Once we receive all your items, we need to sort, box and label and be ready to deliver to Spalding High School. There will be more information coming in the Thursday announcements and in the bulletins.

Just imagine how excited our church in Zimbabwe will be to receive gifts from us. As Bonnie said, "It will be like Christmas". Please start thinking what you want to send to our sisters and brothers in Chiredzi.
