A Note from the Finance Committee

The Finance Committee has been meeting often, struggling with next year's budget and an expected net loss. Last year's numbers at the end of our fiscal year June 30, were a deficit of \$54,000. With inflation, extreme increase in oil prices and many other unusual expenses, we're looking at an even larger deficit. How can we proceed?

By supporting the church in any and every way we can...by making and maintaining_our pledges, making specific donations as opportunities arise, and participating in all our fund-raising functions each year, i.e., baked goods sale, chicken BBQ, rummage sales, and this year, Old Home Days projects.

Thanks to our history of forward-thinking members who left monetary legacies to our church, we do have our Endowment Fund which has continued to support our work throughout centuries—but we can legally draw only a small amount (7%) each year. That is the most important part: we must be fiscally responsible to sustain and nurture that endowment.

Our thanks to our IAT team, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, and the entire Finance Committee for their incredible efforts and expertise!
