STEEPLE PROJECT

June 2022

Built in 1831, the First
Congregational church, including the
steeple, has been a vital part of the visual
imagery of Walpole, New Hampshire. For
191 years the steeple has been the tallest,
most visible part of Walpole. It has endured
191 years of weather, the Civil War, WWI,
the Depression, WWII, the Korean War, the
civil rights movement, the Vietnam War,
and the wars in the Middle East and
Afghanistan.

The steeple has held up well thanks to the stewardship of the church and community. The good news is that the framework of the steeple is solid. But expensive repairs are needed. There's work to be done: the upper-level roofing needs to be replaced, the water damage around the base and molding repaired, the four louvered windows need new screening and better access to the lighting of the steeple, new ladders, and access planking internally and some internal structural repairs. Electrical upgrades are necessary to serve the interior and exterior steeple lights. Lightning protection needs to be certified and repaired. And, of course, it all needs to be painted.

Two decisions were made this spring. The first was to accomplish all the work that needs to be done to the steeple and the second was to invite the community to participate. Let's face facts: we are a smaller, aging membership no different than many mainline churches. We need your support.

STEWARDSHIP

MONEY, MONEY, MONEY. We are accused of always asking for money. Yet, we have approved deficit budgets for the last three fiscal years, had no problem maximizing the withdrawal of funds from the endowment and voted to spend \$110,600 to repair the steeple with money loaned from the government.

This current fiscal year ends June 30, 2022. We are right on budget with the projected expenses. The problem is on the income side, specifically the pledge income. While we received pledges this current fiscal year, the pledge income has not matched the pledges. Please revisit your current pledge and be sure you're up to date. Thank you. And this is particularly difficult because we're right at the start of the new fiscal year and you're being asked to commit to the church for the 2022 – 2023 fiscal year. So far, we have received 33 pledges for \$64,400. That's great! Thank you for remaining committed to our church. Time really flies when it comes to money!

It has been a rough go since COVID-19 hit 27 months ago. We are blessed by a strong endowment, but not one without risk and limitations. In 2014 we utilized endowment funds for the Fellowship Hall renovation but because we needed the endowment for this fiscal year there is no money for the steeple. The Save the Steeple group has an ambitious fundraising plan to offset the loan, but it would be so great if folks stepped forward and contributed generously. We don't enjoy asking for money, but we recognize that the steeple is an important visual part of the church and the town.

It's not an easy time. There is fear about oil prices, gas prices, and food prices. Our faith will carry us a long way. Being a joyful giver reflects our faith and our assurance that God is still speaking. We just need to be good listeners.


